## BEARCATS LOOK TO MAKE IT THREE-IN-A-ROW

Binghamton men's basketball aims for its third straight win when it hosts Cornell on Saturday in the first meeting between the two Upstate New York schools in 16 years. A BU win would give the Bearcats their best start since the 2002-03 squad opened with victories in four of its first five contests.

### LAST TIME OUT

The Bearcats topped Mount St. Mary's (Md.), 66-59, in Monday's home opener at the Events Center. Senior **Steve Proctor** made his 2006-07 season debut, leading four Bearcats in double figures with a career-high 14 points and a team-high five rebounds. Junior **Richard Forbes** scored 14 points on 4-for-6 shooting off the bench while senior **Troy Hailey** hit 3-of-3 from three-point range en route to 11 points and junior **Mike Gordon** added 10 points and six assists.

### CORNELL VERSUS BINGHAMTON

This afternoon's contest marks Binghamton's first matchup with Cornell since moving to the Division I level prior to the 2001-02 season. The two programs met on three occasions during BU's Division III tenure, with the last meeting coming during the 1990-91 season.

## LOOK WHO'S BACK: PROCTOR STARS IN SEASON DEBUT

Playing his first game of the season after recovering from a broken hand, senior Steve Proctor showed no signs of rust in his debut Monday against Mt. St. Mary's (Md.), scoring a career-high 14 points and pulling down a team-best five boards. Coach Al Walker liked what he saw from the 6-4 guard, "Steve was very active and athletic for his first time back. I was very happy with the way he played."

## INSTANT OFFENSE: FORBES PROVIDING PUNCH OFF BU BENCH

Junior guard **Richard Forbes** has quickly established himself as BU's sixth-man, leading the 'Cats in scoring (15.7 ppg.) through their first three games. Forbes has scored in double-figures in each of the last two contests, including a 24-point outburst to lead BU to victory at Niagara. The NYC native is shooting a team-best 87 percent (13-15) at the line and averaging 4.0 rebounds per game.

## FINDING ITS TOUCH

After connecting on only 4-of-24 (14.7%) three pointers in its season opener against LIU, Binghamton has found its touch from long range, shooting a combined 42.5% (17-40) over its last two contests.

## HOME COOKIN'

BU's 66-59 victory over Mt. St. Mary's (Md.) snapped a two-game losing streak in home openers. The win was the Bearcats 20th overall and their ninth in their last 12 at the Events Center. BU owns a .625 winning percentage in 32 games since moving into the \$33.1 million facility midway through the 2003-04 campaign.

## GUARD DRIVEN

Seventy-three percent (145) of Binghamton's 199 total points game have come from its guards. Four Bearcat guards (Forbes, Gordon, Hailey, and Proctor) are currently averaging double-figures in scoring.

## 2006-07 BOX SCORES

### GM 1 - LIU 73, BEARCATS 59

BROOKLYN -- Long Island University built a 10-point halftime lead and held visiting Binghamton to 34% shooting in a 73-59 victory in the season opener for both teams from the Wellness Center.

The Blackbirds opened the game with a 10-0 run and maintained a double-digit lead for much of the contest as the Bearcats struggled to find any offensive rhythm. Binghamton did use an 8-2 run to pull within four, 48-44, with 10:31 remaining, but LIU immediately responded with a 9-0 run to regain its margin.

Long Island put four players in double figures, led by senior guard James Williams, who scored a game-high 17 points.

### GM 2 - BEARCATS 74, NIAGARA 66

NIAGARA UNIV - Junior guard Richard Forbes netted a career-high 24 points, including four-of-six from three-point range, to lead visiting Binghamton to a 74-66 victory over Niagara from the Gallagher Center.

Leading 55-53 with just over seven minutes to play in the second half, BU used a 15-4 run to pull away from the host Purple Eagles en route to its first victory of the 2006-07 season.

Forbes, who paced four Bearcats to score in double figures, delivered a terrific all-around effort, finishing with nine rebounds, a team-high three assists and an 8-of-9 mark from the charity stripe.

### GM 3 - BEARCATS 66 MT. ST. MARY'S 59

VESTAL - Steve Proctor sank three free throws in the final 20 seconds to preserve a 66-59 victory over visiting Mt. St. Mary's in BU's home opener. Binghamton opened the game on a 14-2 run and led from start to finish in earning its second straight win.

Proctor scored a career-high 14 points, and Lazar Trifunovic stemmed a 13-2 late Mountaineers charge with two clutch free throws with 46 seconds left. Mt. St. Mary's had trimmed a 12-point deficit to three, 60-57, with less than a minute remaining, and then intentionally fouled the 6-foot-8 first-year forward. Trifunovic calmly sank the pair and Proctor followed with one free throw with 20 seconds left and two more with 12 seconds remaining. Earlier, Proctor blocked a Mountie three-point attempt and grabbed the rebound - one of five boards.
